Information for the Fudan MBBS Program

An English-Taught Undergraduate Medical Program

Program Overview

According to the "Provisional Regulations on Quality Control Standards of English-Taught Medical Undergraduate Education for International Students in China", the Ministry of Education of China has approved Fudan University as one of thirty universities in China permitted to enroll international students in English-taught undergraduate programs in medicine.

To promote international education, Fudan University began enrolling international students in the English-taught undergraduate medical program in Fall 2008. The program aims to produce high-caliber medical graduates with solid medical knowledge, competent clinical skills, and professionalism, while giving due consideration to the possible needs for them to serve in countries outside of China. Graduates of the program will have the ability to work in medical and health institutions, making meaningful contributions to the areas of patient care, education, and research.

The program is taught completely in English and follows the principles of consolidating academic knowledge, with emphasis on technical skills, interdisciplinary studies, and clinical practice.

Offered by the Shanghai Medical College of Fudan University, this program is open to international students intending to pursue the science and practice of medicine. Students who excel will have the opportunity to participate in overseas clinical internship programs. After completing the required number of credits, students will be conferred a diploma from Fudan University, and qualified students will receive a degree of Bachelor of Medicine and the Bachelor of Surgery (MBBS). Graduates will have the opportunity to register for medical licensing exams in accordance with the requirements of the relevant regulatory bodies of the countries in which they choose to practice.

Graduation diploma and bachelor's degree certificate are awarded to the student upon completion of respective academic requirements laid out in the program curriculum in the prescribed time frame.

Application Requirements:

1. High school graduate or above, qualified for university entrance, medically sound foreigners (applicants with color weakness and color blindness are not eligible to apply).
2. Emigrants from mainland China, Hong Kong, Macau, and Taiwan applying as international students must have obtained their current foreign citizenship for at least four years. In addition, the applicant must have lived abroad for at least 2 years within four years prior to application date.

Required Application Documents:

1. Application Form with the applicant's signature
2. Diploma of highest degree conferred or proof of impending graduation (for applicants in their final year of study) (Original or notarized copy, with notarized Chinese or English translation, if original not in Chinese or English)
3. Transcripts of highest degree conferred (original or notarized copy, with notarized Chinese or English translation, if original not in Chinese or English)
4. Certified copy of TOEFL (IBT) score of 90 or above or IELTS (Academic) score 6.5 or above, taken within two years prior to application date (only for applicants from non-English speaking countries)
5. Photocopy of valid passport identification page. Passport must be valid for at least six months. Applicants currently residing in China must include a copy of the page containing a valid visa or residence permit.
6. Three passport-sized photos (photo must have been taken within the past six months, one is to be attached to the application form)
7. Personal statement, no more than 2000 words in Chinese or English, including (but not limited to) motivation for application and details on academic skills, community activities, awards received, personal strengths, study plan, and life goals.
8. Two letters of recommendation in Chinese or English from whom can attest to the quality of his/her academic performance and scholastic potential. The letters must include referees' phone number and email address.
9. Applicants who are not 18 years old must submit a Guarantor's Form, which can be downloaded off the university website. The guarantor should reside in Shanghai, have an income, and can be a Chinese or foreign citizen.
10. Emigrants from mainland China, Hong Kong, Macau, or Taiwan must submit proof of naturalization with copy of entry and exit stamps on passports from the past four years, or evidence of residing abroad for at least two of the last four years*.
11. Applicants who are not residents of mainland Chinese, Hong Kong, Macau, or Taiwan, but have spent two or more of the last four years* in mainland China, Hong Kong, Macau, or Taiwan as a resident or student, must submit evidence of being foreign citizens at birth.

★ Applicants may send additional documents which may demonstrate their comprehensive abilities along with the required documents; for example, award certificates, admission notices from other universities, etc.

★ Additional application documents may be required when necessary.

★ Application documents will not be returned.

Application and Admission Procedure:

Please finish the online application procedure and pay the application fee during the application period. When the online application is confirmed, print the application form automatically generated by the system, affix a photo in the designated area, and sign.

2. Submission of paper application

Please send the required application documents. These may be submitted in person by the applicant or by others on behalf of the applicant, or submitted by mail or courier to Office for Medical Education, Shanghai Medical College, Fudan University.

3. Interview

Applicants who are invited for an interview will be informed of the exact time of the interview. Applicants living in Shanghai will have a face-to-face interview while other applicants will be interviewed via Skype.

4. Qualified students will be selected according to the results based on interview and application documents.

Master of Arts in Chinese Language and Culture Medium of Instruction: English

Academic Year: two years for degree program; one semester or one year for non-degree program

Introduction:

Chinese Language and Culture is a two-year full-time English-instructed Master of Arts (EMA) program as a subfield of the major Chinese Philology, conducted by the Department of Chinese Language and Literature (DCLL) since 2008. As opposed to teaching Chinese as a second language, this program offers multiple lenses to help the students notice, learn and understand phenomena in the field of Chinese language and culture, using the theories and research methods taught in class. Our research scope focuses not only on ancient Chinese culture, but also on modern and contemporary China. It starts with the approach of linguistics, but also shares many similar characteristics to social science. It is not a long-term language course, but a gateway via the linguistic channel to an in-depth understanding of multiple aspects of China and Chinese society.

Academic staffs of the DCLL have earned national and international recognition for their academic achievements in the disciplines of Chinese linguistics, philology, literature, folklore, etc. Their research does not just restrict to the Chinese language and literature, but involves comparative studies on remarkable works from all over the world. Supported by these successful scholars, seven classes of our EMA students have completed their study and graduated from the department.

After class, we organize different types of events, in order to provide our students from different cultural backgrounds with opportunities to get to know each other, to find their pals for on and off campus activities, to share their experiences in their study and life here at Fudan University and in Shanghai, etc.

We hope you will be successful with your study and enjoy the life at Fudan University. See you in the next September!

Application Requirements:

1. Bachelor's Degree: Applicants are required to hold a Bachelor's or higher degree granted by an accredited college, university or other recognized academic institution after a four-year undergraduate study (or equivalent). Generally applicants graduated from related disciplines are more appreciated, but other applicants with evidence of their excellent study and research ability in the field of linguistics and social sciences are welcome as well;
 2. English Language Proficiency: Applicants are required to submit an International English Language Test System (IELTS) report with overall 6.5 points or above, or Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) report with no less than 90 scores. Applicants who are native speakers of English language or previously have graduated from a purely English-instructed program (with proof) are exempt from this requirement;
 3. Statement of Purpose: Please write up a one to two-page personal statement explaining why you plan to study this program at Fudan University and what you have prepared for the study already, and then talk about your future study plan (what new you still need to learn, what research question you are going to explore, etc.);
 4. Resume or Curriculum Vitae (CV);
 5. Recommendations: Applicants also need to submit recommendation letters from at least two professors in related disciplines;
 6. Writing Sample(s): Applicants must submit at least one writing sample around 2000 words to show their ability of academic writing. The topic of this paper does not have to be related to Chinese language and literature;

Criteria of Course and Credits

Brief introduction to some compulsory courses:

Chinese Language and Culture

This course introduces the basic speech sounds, grammar, social factors, dialects etc. of the Chinese language and a selection of important topics of Chinese culture such as beliefs, art, education, food, festivals etc. It is not assumed that students know the Chinese language; however, they will be required to try to analyze some basic Chinese language data and discuss cultural issues in classroom together with the teacher. Also, students need to take the open-book final exam on Chinese language, and to give a presentation on one topic of Chinese culture or cultural comparison.

Chinese Arts

This course involves a survey of Chinese arts, in both of its ancient and contemporary forms, such as painted pottery, bronze vessel, painting, calligraphy, and film. Emphases will be given on the inner spirits of the relationship between Chinese arts and Chinese philosophy. Since often mythology coins a nation's cultural identity, even if in the unconscious level, the course will start its journey from Chinese mythology. The first part of this course will mainly discuss Chinese painting to show how the transcendental as well as secular spirits intertwine the life of Chinese intellectuals.

Considering we live in an age of globalization and consumer society, however, contemporary Chinese popular culture will also be discussed among which the re-mapping of urban space will be a major topic. By "French Theory in China," this course will trace its Chinese reception back to the happy 1980s when China was benefited from "open police" and began to embrace Western culture through their "Americanization." Nevertheless, French theory is not a version of Parisian fashion, of which only the newest be appreciated. Since late 1990s, cultural studies of CCCS have become a new hegemonic discourse in its Chinese context. The course will display how Chinese academic fervency transmits from "theory" to "culture" finally.

Contemporary Pop Culture in China

Chinese popular culture cannot be properly grasped without the immersion study of what ordinary Chinese people thought, felt, believed, and acted. We will take a generic approach, asking the basic question of what the Chinese people do with their typical forms of popular culture, such as lifestyles, popular literature, film, television, music, opera, food, religion, internet life, etc. We will exam these forms of popular culture primarily from the perspective of their political, ideological, sociological, cultural, and psychological functions. The seminar will focus on 1990s and 2000s PRC popular culture. These subjects will be approached through both written and visual documentation. Students will be expected to do field trips and perform local investigations on the Chinese environment in addition to the weekly readings and discussions.

Ancient Chinese Culture and Tradition

The course gives a brief survey of ancient Chinese culture and tradition, including the natural and human environment, political history, religious beliefs, literature, and idea systems. It also gives some discussions on both external and internal narratives which were often shaped and overstated as Chinese cultural characters and traditions. As kinds of recognitions of Chinese cultural identity, some ancient texts are perused, and some orthodox perspectives and subtle details from beginning through recent time are questioned; in the meantime, some other views from neighboring people and western world are argued and treated with some respect in the reasonable evaluation system. The students who take this course should have comparative perspective and balanced judgment, and are always willing to understand China with the calm and relational eyes.

Chinese Literature in the 20th Century

This course will focus on the study of Chinese novel\poetry\drama in different styles in the 20th century, and some leading Chinese writers will be read in the class, including Lu Xun, Yu Dafu, Mao Dun, Ba Jin, Lao She, Cao Yu, Shen Congwen, Mo Yan, Su Tong, Yu Hua, Wang Anyi etc.

The Introduction to Chinese Newspapers

This graduate level course is designed to introduce the history, theory and practice of contemporary Chinese newspapers. Topics including the legacy of Chinese newspapers, relevant media policies and regulations, the commercialization of Chinese newspapers, working patterns for different news genres and media professionalism will be addressed. The course focuses on discussing the developments and challenges for Chinese journalism within a society undergoing a profound transformation. This course will be conducted with lectures, seminars, presentations and discussions.

Fudan-Paris1 Double Degree Master Program in World Economy(Globalization and World Economy) in English

1. Brief Introduction

The faculty of economics of Paris 1 Pantheon-Sorbonne University and the school of Economics of Fudan University, which are leading Economics Departments in France and China, have joined their efforts to initiate an innovative Double-Degree Masters International Program in Economics specialized in Globalization and World Economy.

This program, starting in 2008, trains Chinese and non-Chinese economists who will become key experts in Euro-Chinese economic relations.

2. Duration of the program

This integrated master program stretches over two years. Students are required to spend their first academic year (3 semesters) at Université Paris 1 and the second academic year (2 semesters) at Fudan University.

3. Program Structure

Year 1 : The first academic year (fall, spring and summer semesters) will be organized in Paris 1 starting from October. For the first two semesters, students will be enrolled in the PSME program. Only students who successfully completes the first two semesters will be allowed to continue. For the third (summer) semester, they will be offered classes specifically organized for them, corresponding to core courses offered in the regular 2nd year program of the Master in Economics specialized in globalization economics.

Courses may be changed, discontinued or otherwise amended at the sole discretion of the Institution delivering that course, and appropriate replacement course shall be identified and communicated to the students.

*The whole program requires 120 European Credits and 56 Chinese Credits.

Master Thesis : During the fifth semester students will prepare a Master thesis under joint supervision of one professor from Fudan and one professor of Paris 1.

4. Selection Standards (For international students)

- Bachelor degree in economics or related disciplines ;
- English language proficiency, certified by a TOEFL certificate (above 550 for PBT, 80 for IBT) or an IELTS certificate (above 6.5); Students who graduated from an English-taught undergrad program are exempt from English proficiency tests ;
- Meet Fudan University's admission requirement for international students.

5. Application

International students (except Chinese Students) should directly apply to Fudan University and Paris1 at the same time. Application materials should be sent to Fudan University and Paris 1 respectively both by mail and in hard copy. Application deadline is April 10th every year or as notified by university website.

Step 1: The first year is the same as the PSME program. Thus, Non-Chinese students should directly apply to the PSME program and state clearly in their letter of motivation that they want to join the Fudan program. Applicants must provide the following:

- A detailed CV in English;
- A cover letter describing interest in the program, accomplishments, and future plans (max: one page);
- Certified English translations of their academic transcripts and a copy of their Bachelor's Degree in Economics or related fields;
- An English language certificate: IELTS with an average score of at least 6.5 or equivalent TOEFL scores (at least 550 for PBT; 80 for IBT);
- Two letters of recommendation, each in an envelope signed across the seal by the recommending professor;
- A copy of your passport;
- The application form.

Step 2 : As you are at the same time enrolled at Fudan University while studying in Paris, you will have to apply directly to Fudan University for the second year of the Double Degree Program. Applicants must provide the following:

- Apply online: <http://admission.iso.fudan.edu.cn/>
- Certified English translations of their academic transcripts and a copy of their Bachelor's Degree in Economics or related fields;
- Statement of purpose describing the motivation for studying at Fudan University in the Double Degree;
- Two letters of recommendation both in sealed envelopes from recommending professors;
- Brief overview of academic research production hitherto;
- English level certificate (equivalent requirements as for PSME);
- Valid passport copy;
- Two passport-sized photos;
- Application fee 800 RMB (Pay online).

General Information

Launched in 2007 and 2012 respectively, EMA Chinese Economy Program and EMA Finance Program are English-taught master's degree programs designed for international students who wish to acquire a comprehensive knowledge of China in the fields of economics, finance, business and national policies. Supported by SOE's well-established discipline of economics, its strong education and research background, and its excellent academic atmosphere, the two programs provide the students with a solid platform to study a wide range of courses related to Chinese economy and finance. Upon graduation, students leave Fudan not only with a master's degree, but also the potential for a successful career in China or at home.

At present, we offer not only general courses such as Macro- and Micro-Economics, Econometrics, Time Series, Development Economics, International Finance and Corporate Finance, but also customized courses such as Chinese Economy, Doing Business in China, China's Taxation System and Fiscal Policy, Chinese Foreign Trade, Industrial Policy of China, World Economy and China, China's Financial System, Capital Markets in China, Social Security System and Its Reform in China, Foreign Direct Investment in Transition Economics, Public Management in China, Urbanization in China, New Political Economics in China, etc.

Chinese Economy Program

Launched in 2007, the Program has proved to be a big success. We now have more than 70 degree students on the program.

1. Specialty: World Economics (Globalization and Chinese Economy)

Finance Program

EMA Finance Program was launched in 2012, and the first cohort of students was recruited in 2013.

2. Degree: Master of Finance

Entry Requirements

For degree students

1. Completion of a four-year or three-year bachelor's or higher degree program from an accredited college or university
2. TOEFL: 550+ (or IBT 90+); or IELTS: 6.5+
(Applicants from countries where English is the official language, or have graduated from English-taught programs are exempted from this requirement.)

Application Procedure

1. Go to <http://admission.iso.fudan.edu.cn/> for online application.
2. Upload required application documents.
3. Pay application fee (800 RMB) online, after which any application information cannot be modified.
4. Send the printed online application form and valid passport copy to Fudan University by post (direct delivery is also acceptable) within 10 working days from the date when the registration fee is paid.

Tuition

For degree students: 80,000 RMB per year

Graduation Criteria

1. To receive a diploma, students must

- Pass the examinations for all compulsory and optional courses (at least 31 credits).
- Pass the thesis defense (3 credits).

2. To receive a degree certificate, students must

- Meet the requirements for receiving a diploma.
- Have a GPA of 2.0 or higher for degree courses.

3. Thesis Requirements

- Total words can not be less than 15,000 (around 50 pages).
- Students are supposed to prepare and compose the thesis for more than one semester.
- Both the composition and defense should be in English.
- Thesis should be academically connected to student's research direction.

COURSE	CONTENTS
Chinese Economy Yin Xiangshuo, Professor PhD, Fudan University Credit: 3 Hours: 48	This course is a special course on Chinese economy. The course is designed to let students understand the great changes in China in the past thirty years through its economic reforms and opening to the outside world, and China's fast economic development. The course is divided into three parts. Part one provides a general introduction to Chinese economy from historical perspectives. Part two deals with the process of China's economic reforms and opening process. The last part turns to issues in China's economic development in the past thirty years.
China's Financial System Yin Xingmin, Professor PhD, University of Essex Credits: 3 Hours: 48	Overview of China's financial system, the banking and intermediation sector, understanding China's interest rates, central banking and the conduct of monetary policy, money and inflation, financial intermediation and credit policy in economic development, the interaction between monetary and fiscal policies, the money markets, the capital markets, the mortgage markets, debate on RMB exchange rate policy, commercial banking industry, banking regulation, securities and investment funds, and financial system and economic performance.
Chinese Foreign Trade Cheng Dazhong, Professor PhD, Fudan University Credits: 2 Hours: 32	This course is comprised of three sections. In Section I, we first introduce basic theories and approaches that are useful for analyzing Chinese foreign trade. Then we look back the long history of Chinese foreign trade and pay special attention to the regime reform of Chinese foreign trade since 1978 and China's response to the latest developments in the global economic and trade institutions. Section II investigates Chinese foreign trade pattern, structure and performance in different settings including neoclassical framework, at the industry-level as well as the firm-level, and in the presence of "trade in tasks" or "trade in value added". The final section discusses the implications of Chinese foreign trade development for China and the rest of the world.
Monographic Study on Chinese Finance Shen Guobing, Professor PhD, Zhejiang University Credits: 3 Hours: 48	This course is aimed to enable students to grasp the basic knowledge introduction to Chinese finance, and apply core advanced economic theory and quantitative methods to the issues of Chinese finance, through lecture learning, literature reading and case thinking.
Social Security System and Its Reform in China Ding Chun, Professor PhD, Fudan University Credits: 2 Hours: 32	Through "China's social security system and its reform" course open for foreign Master students, they can have an understanding of the basic concepts of the social security system, relevant theories and the bud, the formation, the question of reform and the trends of the social security system in the world,. On this basis, the establishment, development, reform and reconstruction of Chinese urban and rural social security system are introduced since the founding of New China.

COURSE	CONTENTS
Environmental and Energy Economics: Approaches and Applications in China WU Libo, Professor PhD, Hiroshima University Credits: 2 Hours: 32	This course aims at delivering comprehensive economic interpretations on the policy mechanisms of environmental and natural resource management. Since policy instruments for environmental and natural Resource management is deeply rooted in economics but also informed by perspectives drawn from political, legal, ecological, and psychological research, this course will involve equity and political thinking.
Applied Econometrics Chen Shiyi, Professor PhD, Kyungpook National University Credits: 2 Hours: 32	This course is designed to be a user-friendly approach to practical econometric analysis for advanced undergraduate students or master students. This is meant to be an applied course, though, I will be using significant amounts of mathematical notation throughout the lectures. Basic familiarity with elementary calculus and statistics is required. Matrix algebra would be helpful.
China's Taxation System and Fiscal Policy Du Li, Associate Professor PhD, Fudan University Credits: 3 Hours: 48	This course is designed to introduce China's taxation system and fiscal policy. It will start with a brief description of the level of China's tax revenue, China's tax legislation system, tax collection and administration system and the taxes payable in China. Then the course will cover the rules of China's major taxes. Various elements such as the scope, taxpayers, taxable items, rates and incentives of these taxes will be discussed. After that, we will recall the major measures taken in China's last two rounds of tax reform and try to forecast the possible steps of future tax reform. In addition, we will discuss China's budget system, intergovernmental fiscal relationship and the major fiscal policy measures and their effects.
China's Reform and Opening-up Zhang Yan, Associate Professor PhD, Peking University Credits: 2 Hours: 32	Why has Chinese economy grown so fast? Where will Chinese economy go? As a major participant in the world economy, China's economic future is important to investors, households, and governments. This course tries to give some explanations to so-called China's Miracle, and more importantly, to discuss current top issues and directions of future opening-up and reform.
World Economy and China Lu Hanyin, Associate Professor PhD, Fudan University Credits: 2 Hours: 32	This course examines the implications of China's emergence as a major player in the world economy. Its integration into the global economy brings major effects for the rest of the world. China's participation in the world economy also offers important opportunities for trade, investment, and international cooperation to promote world prosperity and stability.
Doing Business in China He Xiyou, Associate Professor PhD, Seoul National University Credits: 3 Hours: 48	Fast economic expansion, coupled with a rapid market transformation and a series of government reforms, China has become an increasingly attractive destination to do business. This course is designed to introduce some basic knowledge of Chinese culture, economy, legal system, market entry strategy which are essential to building a successful business in China.
Capital Markets in China Quan Qi, Associate Professor PhD, Katholieke Universiteit Leuven Credits: 2 Hours: 32	This course discusses China's capital market and financial system, based upon a unifying and analytic framework of financial market theories, monetary theories and the role of monetary policy in the economy. By learning this course, the students are expected to learn basic economic principles of money, banking and financial markets and develop in-depth understanding of the latest development of the capital market and financial system in China.
Microeconomics Li Dan, Associate Professor PhD, Boston University Credits: 3 Hours: 48	Economics is the study of how society deals with the problem of allocation of scarce resources across competing uses. Every economic system must answer a few central questions, e.g. what goods to produce, how much of each good to produce, how to produce them, who gets the goods, etc.

COURSE	CONTENTS
Macroeconomics Ge Jinfeng, Assistant Professor PhD, Stockholm University Credits: 3 Hours: 48	The level of this course is intermediate macroeconomics. Macroeconomists are interested to know how far the standard model can explain consumption, investment, unemployment, business cycle, economic growth, money demand ... A bit stretched perhaps, policy implications can be obtained based on relevant frameworks. In the end of the course, students are supposed to know how to solve basic models, and how to map from theory to reality.
International Finance Hu Xu, Assistant Professor PhD, Texas A&M University Credits: 3 Hours: 48	This course studies issues such as the balance of payments, real and nominal exchange rate determination, and macroeconomic policy in open economies.
Foreign Direct Investment in Transition Economy Luo Changyuan, Associate Professor PhD, Vienna University of Economics and Business Administration Credits: 2 Hours: 32	This course will explore the motivation and effects of FDI in host countries. The contents consist of two parts, namely general topics and special issues. As for the part of general topics, we will investigate FDI's role in economic growth and technological progress. As for the part of special issues, we will focus on inward and outward FDI in China. In this part, the first 5 sessions will discuss facts and effects of inward FDI in China. The last session will turn to outward FDI in China.
Industrial Organization Zhou Yu, Assistant Professor PhD, University of Michigan, Ann Arbor Credits: 3 Hours: 48	The purpose of this course is to expose students to topics and techniques frequently discussed in Industrial Organization Literature. The first half will cover demand, supply, entry and matching. The second half will cover single-agent dynamics and market dynamics.
Development Economics Liu Yu, Assistant Professor PhD, Yale University Credits: 3 Hours: 48	The course covers some of the central issues in recent development economics literature and introduces a variety of methodological approaches to study these issues. It draws on a broad range of research papers and emphasizes particularly on their empirical methods. The goal of this course is to transform students into researchers who can conduct independent projects related to economic development.
New Political Economics in China Lan Xiaohan, Assistant Professor PhD, University of Virginia Credits: 3 Hours: 48	This course includes 16-18 lectures. We will discuss some economic theories and empirical evidence on nation and state, government, and bureaucracy, in order to understand the conflict and balance of interests on different levels. Then these theories are confronted with China's history and current affair.
Advanced Topics on Chinese Economy Zhang Jun, Professor, Dean PhD, Fudan University And Other Guest Professors Credits: 2 Hours: 32	The objective of the course is to make students understand China's economic transition and development, focusing on the role of government as well as the markets. The course runs for sixteen weeks with sixteen topics in Fall semester and has two academic hours every week.
Urbanization in China Wang Zhi, Assistant Professor PhD, Brown University Credits: 3 Hours: 48	The goal of this course is to give students an understanding of how to apply the latest thinking and research in economics to analyze a series of topics related to urbanization in China.

General Information

Program Overview:

The EMA in Chinese History and Culture is a two-year study program which aims to provide opportunity for international students without prior knowledge of the Chinese language to study Chinese history toward a Master's degree in Shanghai, one of the most exciting cities in China. All courses except Chinese language courses under the program are taught in English by our highly qualified faculty.

Courses in the program consist of three blocks:

- 1) Chinese language courses for different levels;
- 2) general surveys of ancient and modern Chinese history;
- 3) in-depth research courses focusing on art and religion in ancient China, history and culture of Shanghai, comparative perspectives on Chinese and other ancient civilizations.

For those who are able to follow courses in Chinese they can also choose from a wide range of courses taught in our department. Students in the program will have a unique opportunity to studying Chinese history and culture while experiencing it in person.

Degree and Non-Degree Study:

For students who pursue a Master's degree, a minimum of two years is generally required in order to complete the program. They will be required to complete a total of thirty-one course credits and a dissertation written in English of no fewer than 10,000 words. The dissertation should be defended successfully before being submitted with an abstract in Chinese.

While developed mainly to fulfill requirements for a Master's degree, our program also accommodates for those who wish to follow our courses for any length of period from one semester onwards with no intention of obtaining a degree.

Once admitted, every student, degree or non-degree, may choose a faculty as his or her supervisor according to his or her research interest with the help of our EMA coordinator.

Courses:

A degree student is required to complete requires students to complete thirty-one credits (including eight credits for Chinese language courses, twenty credits in history and culture and three credits for academic activities) during two academic years and successfully defend their Master thesis. He or she may make a course plan with the help of his or her supervisor.

Non-degree students may take courses in the light of requirements in their home institutions.

Living on Fudan Campus:

Almost all of the 35,000 students at Fudan University live on campus, which means that they have many opportunities to associate with each other. International students are provided with accommodation with reasonable charges.

Standard double room costs CNY55 per day per person for long-term students and CNY70 per day per person for short-term students.

Standard single room costs CNY80 per day for long-term students and CNY100 per day for short-term students.

All rooms come with private bathroom, air-conditioning, telephone, and Internet access.

Admission and Application

Eligibility

For Degree Students:

Credentials documenting prerequisite academic work and showing ability to pursue a graduate program in one's chosen area are required. To be considered for admission, one should have completed the equivalent of a four-year B.A. or higher degree from an accredited college or university prior to beginning graduate study. For applicants from non-English speaking countries, a Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) score of 90 or higher, or an International English Language Testing Service (IELTS) score of 6.5 or higher, is required. Applicants from countries where English is the official language are exempted from this requirement.

For Non-degree Student:

Applicants must either be enrolled in an undergraduate or graduate program in an institution of higher education, or have completed a bachelor's degree.

What to Prepare before Applying?

Applicants should submit the following documents together with the application form.

For Degree Students:

1) a photocopy of diplomas for each previous college-level degree program; 2) a photocopy of score transcripts for each previous college-level degree program; 3) two letters of recommendation; 4) a photocopy of TOEFL or IELTS scores if applicable; 5) a résumé; 6) a statement of purpose; 7) a writing sample of no more than 2000 words; 8) a photocopy of passport if available.

For Non-degree Student:

1) a résumé; 2) a statement of purpose; 3) photocopies of official documents of educational background; 3) a photocopy of TOEFL or IELTS scores if applicable; 4) a photocopy of passport if available.

Tuition and Application Fee:

Tuition for a degree student is CNY 100,000 in total. For non-degree student, the tuition is CNY 25,000 per semester. Tuition can be paid in installments for every year or every semester.

A non-refundable application fee of CNY 800 for degree-program (CNY 400 for non-degree) will be charged by the International Student Office of Fudan University. No waiver of this requirement is granted. The application fee must be paid online.

How to Apply

An initial examination of your application will be conducted by the University. Once passed, please pay an application fee online.

For application procedures, please refer to the notice of International Students Office of Fudan University.

Applicants must provide copies of their diplomas and transcripts in either Chinese or English. If the original ones are not written in either of the two languages, the applicant must provide the notarized copies of these documents in Chinese or English.

Deadlines for Application:

Our **degree program** starts from the beginning of September, each school-semester year. Applications should be submitted between December 1 and April 31 of the following year for the coming degree program. If the applicants plan to apply for the scholarships, he or she must submit the application before **February 19**.

Non-degree study may start from either the Fall or the Spring semester. To apply for the Fall semester, applications should be submitted between March 1 and May 31. To apply for the coming Spring semester, applications should be submitted between September 1 and November 30.

Admission decisions will be posted on <http://iso.fudan.edu.cn> during late June to early July of each year, and the welcome package, including a letter of admission, a Foreign Student Visa Application Form (Form JW202), and other guides will be sent to the applicants.

Applicants should bring **the letter of admission**, the completed **Foreign Student Visa Application Form** (Form JW202) to the Chinese embassy in the country of residence or the nearest Chinese consulate-general for the X or F Visa.

(Note: Applicants should retain the original Form JW202 themselves. The Chinese embassy or consulate-general only requires a photocopy.)

Applicants must register at the Department of History with the letter of admission and the Foreign Student Visa Application Form (Form JW202) no later than the registration deadline indicated in the letter of admission. Late registration without prior approval will not be accepted. They must also purchase the insurance for international students (CNY 800 per person per year) approved by the Chinese Ministry of Education to cover their medical costs as part of their registration.

Available Scholarships to degree students:

The Chinese and Shanghai government scholarships: they cover the tuition fee or tuition fee, on-campus accommodation and living subsidy of the applicant.

Apply via Fudan University:

Applicants can apply for both scholarships after they are preliminarily admitted. Applicants may submit the application for the scholarship together with the application for admission. Incoming (new) students can apply for the Chinese Government Scholarship (Class B) and Shanghai Government Scholarship (Class A and B) at the same time.

English-Taught Master's Programme in Electronics and Communication Engineering

Programme Introduction

This programme was jointly initiated by Fudan University, China and University of Turku (UTU), Finland. It is a 2.5-year full time English-taught programme with an emphasis on Embedded Electronics. There are two optional tracks in this programme.

Track 1 (Double Master's Degree)

Students who have been admitted by Fudan University aiming at getting double master's degree can apply for the study right at UTU as well. UTU will select students based on their eligibility, study success (at Bachelor's level) and interviews (in English). English proficiency is ensured during an interview. The selected students will have a mandatory one-semester (according to the current arrangement it is the second semester) exchange to UTU, Finland. After completing this programme, students will receive the Master of Engineering Degree from Fudan majoring in Electronics and Communication Engineering and the Master of Science Degree from UTU majoring in Information and Communication Technology.

Track 2 (Fudan Degree only)

Students in this track only study at Fudan for 2.5 years. After the completion of study, students will receive the Master of Engineering Degree from Fudan majoring in Electronics and Communication Engineering.

Tuition Fees

Tuition fee at Fudan is 97500 RMB/programme.

Tuition fee at UTU is 4000 Euro/programme for non-EU/EEA students (no tuition fee for EU/EEA students).

Students in Track 1 should pay tuition fees to both universities. Students in Track 2 only pay the Fudan tuition fee.

The Doctoral Program in International Politics has two phases: coursework and dissertation writing. Each doctoral student must complete a minimum of 19 credit hours of coursework (minimum 9 credits of core coursework, minimum 4 credits of Chinese language coursework, minimum 4 credits of elective coursework, and minimum 2 credits of independent study coursework) and meet Fudan University's minimum GPA requirement for a doctoral degree. Besides completing coursework, each student must write a dissertation and pass the oral defense. Students should publish academic articles in international journals or present papers of good quality at international academic conferences during their doctoral study.

Core Courses

International Politics and Theories

This is a required course for students in the Doctoral Program in International Politics. This course is designed to assist students in acquiring knowledge about international politics and theories. The goal of the course is to provide students with a thorough understanding of international politics from both theoretical and factual perspectives. It will mainly focus on contending theories, i.e., different theoretical perspectives, on international relations (IR). Students are required to not only understand various IR theories, as well as their relations, but also employ those theories to describe and explain international events.

Research Methods for Political Science

This is a required course for students in the program. It offers an in-depth introduction to both quantitative and qualitative research methods in political science. It is designed to equip students with knowledge and techniques for reading scholarly articles and conducting their own academic research. The course introduces the general principles for conducting political science research, some practical techniques for writing research proposals and research papers at Fudan University, and the major research methods for political science.

Research Design and Individual Study

The course aims to develop the student's ability to formulate researchable questions and appreciate different approaches to researching these problems; draw on and apply key theoretical concepts from one or more of the social-science disciplines; understand the relationship between theory testing and empirical evidence; understand and apply a range of research methods; appreciate cross-cultural differences; collect, assess and analyse data; and develop a thesis proposal.

Degree and Requirements

The Master of Public Management comprises coursework, practice and thesis components. The aim of the coursework component is to prepare you to think like a public management professional and to lay the foundations for developing a thesis in this field. Students are introduced to the origins, scope, key concepts and variables, issues, methods, theoretical frameworks, and assumptions that define the discipline of Public Management. You will debate the merits of contradictory perspectives, read the empirical and conceptual literature of the discipline and critique the work of key theorists and researchers. You will design, implement, and critique different public managerial and operational systems.

Degree Requirements: Courses and Grades

- A student must satisfy the requirements for the degree that are in force at the time the degree is to be awarded.
- At least 30 credits must be completed, all required courses and electives finished.
- All courses ARE numerically graded C and above, or have a grade of Pass ('P') count toward the 30 credit total.
- Courses graded LOWER than C do not count towards the 30 credit total.
- If a student repeats a non-repeatable class, only one set of credits will be counted toward the 30 credit total.
- A minimum cumulative GPA (grade point average) of above 2.0 (2.0 excluded) is required for a graduate degree at the University.

Degree Requirement: Procedures, Paperwork and Duration

Fudan University and SIRPA at a Glance

It is located in a cosmopolitan global city, Shanghai, also an important economic center of China and the world.

It aims to train the best talents for state and public affairs, and potential academics. The subject of international relations in SIRPA is ranked in the most first level in China. It attracts hundreds foreign students in different level from undergraduate, master to Ph.D, and various exchange program participants.

Introduction of the DD Program

The Double Degree Program on Europe and Asia in Global Affairs was established by Fudan University and Sciences Po in 2010. It provides students who are interested in analysing European and Asian affairs from both comparative and international relations perspectives with the excellent research network between Fudan University and Sciences Po.

This program is aimed, at the same time, at European specialists who would like to deepen their understanding of Europe through comparing it to Asia, at Asian specialists who aspire to strengthen their understanding of Asia in relation to other regions, at international relations specialists who are eager to acquire a more specific insight on the challenges and content of Europe-Asia relations.

The DD program lasts two academic years. The first year will be spent at Sciences Po, in the Master Program of European Affairs, and the second year will take place within the School of International Relations & Public Affairs at Fudan University in the Master Program of International Politics. Students remain enrolled in both institutions for both years; they will therefore benefit from all the students' services (free access to library, student unions, career services ...). Courses are multidisciplinary and students will have International Relations, History, Economics, Law, and Political Science with focus on Europe and Asia in Global Affairs. Students will follow two language classes at Sciences Po, preferably chosen within Chinese, French and English. At Fudan, all courses will be offered in English, although non-Chinese students are highly recommended to learn Mandarin by taking Mandarin classes offered by the International Cultural Exchange School.

Assessment will be the same as for the regular students enrolled in the school where the students study. A two-month internship is mandatory after the second semester, between June and September. At Fudan University students will write a master thesis. Final graduation will rely on the validation by the student of both years of the programme. Therefore, students get a temporary graduation in July at Sciences Po and graduate definitely once all the program is validated at Fudan University in the following year.

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FLS LL.M. Program in Chinese Business Law taught in English *

Brief Introduction

Since 2010, Fudan Law School has launched the LL.M. Program in Chinese Business Law instructed in English for foreign lawyers, executives, students, and professional engaging in international trade and/or interested in Chinese business and financial law. It is designed to take advantage of Shanghai's position as a center of business and finance, including major courses in commercial law and financial law among others. Through the two-year study and research, students can develop a comprehensive understanding of Chinese business and financial legal system so that they can be independently engaged in the financial or legal practice and theory study.

Application Requirements

Language Requirements:

Applicants whose native language is not English should provide a TOEFL (iBT) score of 90 or above/an IELTS score of 6.5 or above/the equivalent on another standardized English language test such as the Cambridge English exam. Applicants scoring below or who have not taken an English language exam may request an interview with the admissions staff to obtain a waiver.

Requirements for Dissertation Writing

- 1) Before determining the dissertation title, the student must do thorough research on the academic achievements in the related field, and the topic must be about a new or significant issue in the academic field.
- 2) The topic of the dissertation must be specific and definite, with an academic value. The topic must be approved by the academic supervisor of the student and the dissertation must be independently completed by the student.
- 3) The dissertation is expected to form a new thought which is distinct from the existing academic achievements with a clear and definite opinion, and strong argument; the materials cited in the dissertation must be accurate and reliable. The writing must be logic and fluent, with strong analytical skills and be highly persuasive.
- 4) The dissertation must be written in English with rich and solid coverage. The total words of the dissertation should be 12,000 – 15,000 English words.
- 5) The dissertation must be completed and submitted on or before April 20 of the second year of study, and the oral defense will be scheduled in late May or early June.

Period of Study and Tuition

This is a two-year program consisting of one-year course work and one-year dissertation. The total tuition fee for the program is RMB 160,000 Yuan. Students need to pay half the tuition (80,000 Yuan) before the beginning of the fall semester, and the other half before the beginning of the spring semester.

Scholarships

FLS have two kinds of scholarships. The first one is Freshman Scholarship and applicants can apply it together with the application for the program. The Scholarship Evaluation Committee will evaluate applicants' grades in their college and other performance. The second one is Academic Scholarship. After students get the grades of the first semester, they can apply for the scholarship. The Scholarship Evaluation Committee will evaluate students' grades and academic performance, and then they will decide whether students get the scholarship and which class students can get.

EMA Program in Chinese Philosophy and Culture

Fudan University (Shanghai, China)

I. Academic Programs

Overview

These programs are aimed to offer opportunities of learning Chinese and studying Chinese philosophy to overseas postgraduates or college juniors and seniors who have not yet been able to master the Chinese language. In addition to Chinese language classes, these programs offer courses on Chinese philosophy as well as other related courses in English at Fudan University. Fudan University is a leading institution of higher education in China, and is experienced with and renowned for educating overseas students. The School of Philosophy at Fudan is a top philosophy program in China. The university is located in Shanghai, the most dynamic city of China that belongs to a region that is rich in Chinese traditions and cultures. It has been six years since these programs were launched in 2011, and 68 students have been enrolled in either the M.A. program (56 students) and the visiting student program (12 students). They are from the U.S., Canada, Puerto Rico, the U.K., Sweden, the Netherlands, Denmark, Germany, France, Spain, Italy, Ireland, Iceland, Poland, Romania, Yugoslavia, Montenegro, Russia, Israel, Turkey, India, Indonesia, and Gambia, and many of them are top students in their classes, majoring in philosophy, classics, and/or East Asian or Chinese studies. The above facts make these programs simply the most successful of their kind (English-based post-graduate programs in Chinese philosophy) in mainland China.

M.A. Program

This is a two-year degree program. The students who apply for the program should have a college degree from an accredited institution upon entering the program. The students are required to get at least 31 credits (6 credits for 3 courses in Chinese Language, 15 credits for five required major courses and 8 credits for 4 elective courses) in order to graduate. A master's thesis is also required for obtaining the master's degree. Other than the above courses, students are also allowed to take courses that are offered by other departments at Fudan University (up to 6 credits per semester).

Visiting Student Program

This is a one-year program. The students who apply for the program should be postgraduate students or students who will be in their junior or senior years upon entering the program. The students must complete 3-4 major courses, and 1-2 courses of Chinese. Upon the completion of the program, the students will be given a certificate. Other than the above courses, students are also allowed to take courses that are offered by other departments at Fudan University (up to 6 credits per semester).

Audit Program

This program is based upon individual courses. The students must have a college degree, or a proof of active enrollment in an accredited college and the completion of their junior year of studies. A transcript of courses taken in this program will be offered upon request. If the students decide to pursue either of the above two programs later, these courses may be carried over.

II. Requirements for Master's Degree Program

Chinese Language Courses

3 courses, and maximum of 6 credits will be counted toward your degree. If students take a 4-credit language course, only 2 credits out of the 4 will be counted toward the degree requirements. For students whose Chinese is so good that they don't consider taking Chinese Language courses necessary, these courses can be replaced with Chinese philosophy courses offered in Chinese.

One Chinese tutor will be assigned to every two foreign students in the program who have similar Chinese level. The tutor will meet with the two students for 2 hours every week during the semester, studying classical Chinese together. The tutors are selected from Chinese graduate students at the School of Philosophy.

Thesis

Around 20,000 words and up with a 5,000 Chinese character summary

Students will discuss their thesis proposal at the end of their first year of studies. They will be required to defend their proposals at the end of September in the second year. The mid-term exam of their thesis will take place in the middle of December in the second year. The complete draft of their thesis will be submitted in the middle of March in the second year. The final defense takes place in June in the second year.

III. List of Faculty Members Who Regularly Teach Major and Elective Courses

Prof. BAI Tongdong (program director) holds a Ph.D. in philosophy from Boston University, and was a tenured associate professor at Xavier University in Cincinnati before he joined Fudan University in the rank of full professor. He was the first and so far the only tenured philosophy teacher from the U.S. who has returned to China as a full time faculty member. His research interests include Chinese philosophy and political philosophy, especially the comparative and contemporary relevance of traditional Chinese political philosophy. He has published many articles in some prestigious journals in these areas, and has a book out in Chinese by the Peking University Press, *A New Mission of an Old State: the Comparative and Contemporary Relevance of Classical Confucian Political Philosophy*. The English and revised version of this book is now under review for its publication in the English-speaking world. He has also published a book in English, an introduction to traditional Chinese political philosophy that is presented from a comparative perspective, showing its contemporary relevance (*China: The Political Philosophy of the Middle Kingdom*, Zed Books). He has been invited to speak at many academic institutions all over the world.

Prof. CAI Qinghua holds a Ph.D. in philosophy from the Hong Kong University of Science and Technology. Her research interests include Daoism and Wei-Jin Xuanxue.

Prof. Eberhard Guhe studied Indology, logic and mathematics at the University of Münster as well as at the University of Vienna, where he passed his MA and PhD in Indology with a thesis on Indian logic. His teaching interests include Indian philosophy (especially logic).

Prof. Lawrence Lau studied at various institutions in Hong Kong, mainland China, and Canada before he obtained his Ph.D. from the Hong Kong University of Science and Technology. He has published widely in the studies of Buddhism.

Prof. LI Tiangan holds a Ph.D. from Fudan University under the supervision of Prof. ZHU Weizheng, one of the leading scholars in Confucian classical studies (jingxue) in China. He has been a visiting scholar to academic institutions all over the world. He has published both in Chinese and English, and has regularly taught courses in English. His research interests include jing xue (Confucian classical studies) and the cultural exchanges between China and the West.

Prof. Benoit Vermander holds M.A., Ph.D., and Th.D. from a few leading academic institutions from France, the U.S., and Taiwan. He has taught at Fordham University in New York, among other places. His research interests include political philosophy and Chinese spiritualities and religions.

Prof. CHANG Tzu-li holds a Ph.D. from National Chengchi University. His research interests include Neo-Confucianism and comparative philosophy.

Prof. CHEN Jia holds a Ph.D. from UIUC, and her research interests include Chinese aesthetics, aesthetics, and philosophy of education. Prof. YU Zhejun holds a Ph.D. from the University of Leipzig, and his research interests include the sociology of religion, Chinese popular religions, and the philosophy of social sciences.

IV. Tuition and Living Expenses

Tuition for the M.A. and Visiting Students Programs is RMB 50,000 per year. Students are also required to cover other expenses while living in Shanghai. Rooms are available in on-campus International Students Dormitories, and the monthly rent for a single room (with a shared bathroom) ranges from RMB 1,350 per month to 2,700 per month. Meals at an on-campus dining facility cost less than RMB 1,000 per month.

V. Scholarships

Various types of scholarships are available.

- 1) Government Scholarships through Fudan. The Chinese and Shanghai governments' fellowships will cover either the tuition only or the tuition and accommodation on-campus, as well as some living expenses. We have a great track-record of securing these fellowships for our applicants for the MA program. Please note, if you also apply for another MA program from another mainland Chinese university, and apply for full scholarship through it, the Chinese government will give you scholarship to go to one MA program decided by the Chinese government, and this scholarship cannot be carried to the program of your own choosing. That is, if you apply for two or more MA programs in mainland China, and apply for scholarships through them, you can only get governmental scholarship to one of the programs and you cannot control which program you can enroll with the scholarship.
- 2) Government Fellowship applied independently. The applicant, especially if he or she applies for the one-year visiting program (so far, no full scholarship is available to one-year visiting students through Fudan), can also apply for the Chinese Government Scholarship (CGS, <http://en.csc.edu.cn>), Confucius Institute Scholarships (through Confucius Institutes or the Chinese consulates in the applicant's home countries), or other scholarships on his or her own. However, if you apply for the CGS on your own, the Ministry of Education may assign you to an institution not of your choosing, while applying for the CGS through Fudan (which is now only available to applicants for the MA program) will guarantee that you will come to Fudan.
- 3) Fudan University also offers Fudan Student Fellowships annually to second-year International Students based on a campus-wide competition that can cover part of the tuition, ranging from RMB 5,000 to 15,000/year.
- 4) The School of Philosophy offers RMB 5,000/semester to students who pay tuition out of their own pockets, take a full-course load (4 courses/semester), and maintain a B+ average. No separate application is needed.
- 5) Yan Zhuping Fellowship. RMB 5,000. Only students who pay for the tuition are eligible, and no separate application is needed.
- 6) Fotile Scholarship. RMB 5,000. Only students who pay for the tuition are eligible, and no separate application is needed.
- 7) Other forms of fellowships may also become available in the near future.
- 8) In addition, help will be offered to students who wish to find part-time jobs (such as instructor for spoken English) to support their studies in these programs.

VI. Application

For students who wish to enroll in the Fall semester in any given year (so far, no Spring admission is available), the start date for applications is early December of the previous year. The priority deadline is February 19 of the same year as that of enrollment. Applications that are submitted after February 19 and before May 1 may be considered, but government fellowships (through Fudan) won't be available for students who fail to submit their applications before the priority deadline. The official admission results will be announced in late June or early July on this website: <http://iso.fudan.edu.cn>, and an admission package will be sent out after the announcements. A confirmation email can be sent to you earlier by request.

For college seniors applying for the MA program, a letter from the university that claims that the student in question will graduate by September is needed, and the student needs to bring the diploma to Fudan upon registration.
- (6) Two (2) letters of recommendation.
- (7) Proof of English language efficiency if the student's native language is not English and the student hasn't attended college(s) in which courses are taught in English. An IBT score of 90 or higher or an IELTS score of 6.5 or higher is required. (If it is not the original copy, it needs to be notarized.)
- (8) A personal statement of less than 1,000 words (study and work experiences, academic achievements, research proposal, and career plan after the Fudan programs, etc.).
- (9) A writing sample of less than 5,000 words.
- (10) A list of scholarly works if applicable. es place in June in the second year.

Scholarship application through Fudan:

(11) After your application is received and reviewed, a preliminary decision will be made on whether you will be admitted. If preliminarily admitted, you will be notified and will be allowed to go on to fill out your scholarship application. The notice will be emailed to you in early March, and you need to submit your scholarship application by April 10. For scholarship application, please check the website http://iso.fudan.edu.cn/xuexi_sh.htm for procedures. Pay particular attention to scholarships for new students. Only the Chinese Government Scholarship, Shanghai Government Scholarship (SGS) Class A, and Shanghai Government Scholarship (SGS) Class B are applicable to the incoming (new) students. To apply for ALL OF THE THREE fellowships will increase your chance to get a fellowship.

Master Program for Chinese Religious Studies in English

Fudan University (Shanghai, China)

PROGRAMS TAUGHT IN ENGLISH

I. Overview

In recent decades, discussion in public sphere and academic research about Chinese religions is becoming a cross-cultural phenomenon, in the tide of globalization and revitalization of faith. For the purpose of training experts in the future and promising young scholars in the field of Chinese religions, the School of Philosophy Fudan University resolves to launch a master program for Chinese religious studies in English, starting in fall semester 2015, which is open for global application.

The School of Philosophy Fudan University has long-term corporation and friendship with all religious communities in Shanghai as well as in Mainland China. This program plans to organize regular visits for all students, and provides field research possibilities, so that students are able to have direct encounter with living Chinese religions, besides understanding the theory and classical texts.

II. Years of study

M.A. Program: This is a two-year degree program.

Visiting Student Program: This is a one-year non-degree program.

Audit Program: This program is based upon individual courses.

III. Curriculum for Master's Degree Program

All courses are delivered in English

1. Courses of Chinese language: 6 credits (2X3 courses, compulsory);
2. Practical courses (field research and visit): 4 credits (2X2 courses, compulsory);
3. Major courses: 23 credits (at least 8 courses, including 5 required and 3 elective).
4. Thesis (around 20,000 words and up with a 3,000 to 5,000 Chinese character summary).

IV. Requirements of granting degree:

1. Get the prescribed credit (normally within two years);
2. Write an academic thesis under the supervision of a professor, and pass the oral defense.

V. Courses

The courses are divided in to three levels, namely basic, intermediate and advanced, so that student can choose different ones according to his/her own pre-knowledge in the area(see the diagram below, incomplete, for your reference only).

PROGRAMME DESCRIPTION

About a fifth of all the people in the world live in China. At the same time as China has the longest continuous culture surviving from ancient times, globalisation widely affects Chinese culture and society. And as a country, China will have big influence in the politics and economics of the twenty-first century. Chinese culture and society is undergoing dramatic changes in the era of globalisation and transformation.

The two-year English-instructed master's degree program in Chinese Society and Public Policy is a full time program, with five different program options, that provides rigorous training in sociology and social policy, covering a broad range of topics from sociology, anthropology, social policy and demography. By choosing this program students will get the opportunity to take courses taught by some of China's leading sociologists and be part of an academic environment that prides itself on being on the forefront of sociology & public policy research. The program provides an excellent opportunity for students with little or no Chinese language skills to develop a deep understanding of China in the modern world.

The program is taught at the prestigious School of Social Development and Public Policy (SSDPP) of Fudan University. DURATION

Depending on the different demands of students, English-instructed Master Program in Chinese Society and Public Policy (EMA) can be either semester course or degree course.

In terms of degree students, EMA consists of a two-year full-time course study. The first year of the program is designed to provide a solid grounding in Chinese culture, society and issues of social development. The third semester of the program provides research opportunity on China. Master students are required to complete and defend an MA thesis.

In terms of non-degree students, EMA can be 1-2 semester programme. It will allow students to have the opportunity to not only study Mandarin and experience Chinese culture and local people, but collect credits from courses on postgraduate level at one of the top universities in Asia.

Scholarships:

Students may be qualified for Chinese government scholarship or Shanghai government scholarship. Students supported by scholarship will be waived the program tuition.

Joint Degree Programme of Fudan University and University College Dublin (UCD) MSc Software Engineering (Professional Degree)

Fudan University

The Software School of Fudan University, founded in 2002, is one of the original 37 national demonstration software schools. By design, the school is to cater to the needs of the information technology training in the Internet era, and puts efforts to build a comprehensive curriculum that ranges from underlying system software to application layer and business applications. Today, the school is home to a software engineering laboratory, a broadband network and interactive multimedia laboratory, an e-commerce research center, an interactive graphics lab, a parallel processing institute, a cryptography and information security research lab, a public performance and information technology research center, a CC-CMM international standard research center, a data analysis and security laboratory, and other research labs.

The Fudan MSc in Software Engineering programme offers systematic training for students who want to start a career of engineers and managers in IT and Internet industry. The programme provides a series of specialized courses such as Formal Program Construction, Practical Software Development, Electronic Commerce, Advanced Database, Advanced Topics in Software Engineering, Requirements Engineering, and Distributed Computing. All the courses are taught in English by lecturers from Fudan and UCD.

University College Dublin

Ireland is home to the world's top 10 technology companies. It is known as the Internet and Games Capital of Europe and is among the world's most technologically developed nations. There are excellent job opportunities, with 5,000 job vacancies in the sector at present.

The UCD MSc in Software Engineering is a uniquely flexible and innovative programme. It offers a negotiated learning (NL) model for students with an ICT background that allows students to customize their learning paths and to tailor what they learn to their own specific needs and career aspirations. Module choices include several programming languages, cloud computing, bioinformatics, data mining, machine learning and robotics.

Fudan University and UCD wish to provide students with a joint programme allowing for credit transfers between Fudan and UCD contributing to the award of Masters Degree of Software Engineering from Fudan University, and Masters Degree of Software Engineering from UCD. Fudan and UCD have been working closely together for over 13 years providing an international dimension to education.

Training Methods

Study Period: two and a half years.

The joint programme consists of three parts:

One year of study at Fudan University to finish all the courses required for Fudan degree, which include at least 10 UCD-equivalent credits that are taught by UCD staff or approved by UCD, and will be accredited in Phase 2 by UCD;

One year of study at UCD to finish all the courses required for UCD degree; Practical training experience at UCD is accredited by Fudan.

A half-year at either UCD or Fudan for the preparation and defense of a thesis for the Fudan degree.

Highlights

This joint programme will provide a systematic arrangement of specialized practice (industrial practice or academic practice) for each student. Each student is required to make a plan for practice arrangement in his/her first term in Fudan and complete the practice arrangement in the following periods at Fudan and UCD. An industrial practice arrangement includes an integrated internship in IT or Internet companies that have research and development centers in both Ireland and Shanghai. An academic practice arrangement includes one or more research or engineering projects that are co-advised by Fudan professors and UCD professors.

Applicant must not be a Chinese citizen, and be in good mental and physical health, and hold an honour degree (2.1) Bachelor's degree (GPA minimum 3.08) in Computer Science or Software Engineering or related certificate.

Language Requirement:

Students will be required to successfully demonstrate that they have English language proficiency to a level deemed appropriate by both universities. For the UCD phase, UCD requires the equivalent of a minimum of IELTS 6.5 with each component at level 6.0 or better.
